### **Darien Technology & Community Foundation Glassmeyer is new chairman**

Ward Glassmeyer will replace founder and first chairman Richard L. Chilton Jr. as the new board chairman of the Darien Technology & Community Foundation. Replacing Glassmeyer as vice chairman are Jim Steinthal and Jennifer Foster, who will be co-vice chairmen.

Glassmeyer has served as vice chairman for several years and has been instrumental in the success of the foundation's annual fund-raising galas and annual appeal drives, which have significantly increased the funds available for grant making.

Chilton announced last year that he would be relinquishing his position as chairman this year.

He will still support the DT & CF as chairman emeritus. Under his leadership, the DT&CF expanded its mission in June 2007 to include funding for capital projects in Darien, as well as for technology.

The Darien Technology & Community Foundation began in 1998 with a \$500, 000 donation from Chilton and his wife, Maureen. Over the course of 10 years, the foundation has made grants totaling more than \$1.6

million to all of the Darien public schools, the Darien Library, EMS Post 53, the fire departments and to the police boat fund-raiser. In addition, grants to the ABC

House, Channel 79, the Depot, the senior center and the Darien Historical Society have also been awarded.
